MR. BULT'S MESSAGE

Dear LHS Families, Students, and Community,

This past Saturday, a work crew spent time during the morning and early afternoon helping make the LHS campus look better. Some pulled weeds from flower beds. Others turned up old mulch and then added new mulch on top. Still others trimmed around trees, bushes, the islands, and wherever the mowers had missed. One person power washed the front exterior of LHS, including the gutters, windows, and soffit.

Are you a "spring cleaner"? Do you take time to go through your house and clean rooms? Perhaps, you prefer to be the outside person making the lawn and flower beds look nice. These past few weeks, my family has been cleaning both the inside and outside of our house. After helping at LHS on Saturday, and as I worked in my own yard, I could not help but think about how often I "spring cleaned" my heart, mind, and spirit. Regrettably, not often enough. As the Apostle Paul wrote, I am the foremost of sinners (1 Timothy 1:15). God made His plan (Word), put that plan into action (sending Jesus), and provided protection for all that was made clean (Holy Spirit).

First, God cleanses our minds and our hearts through hearing His Word. God invites us to read the Bible every day and spend time with Him in prayer. He encourages us to gather together with likeminded individuals to meditate on His Word and come to a better understanding of it in small and large group Bible studies. He commands us, in the Third Commandment, to go to church weekly. It is here that we hear God speak to us through the pastor's words of forgiveness and absolution. *"Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow"* (Psalm 51:7).

Second, God cleanses our souls through Him coming to us through physical means. He sent Jesus into the world. Jesus lived a perfect life on our behalf, died the death we deserved, and then rose from the dead. God still comes to us through physical means. In baptism, God comes to us through water included in His command and combined with His Word. He claims us as His own through the washing of rebirth and renewal in Him. In baptism, God washes us clean from our sins. God also cleanses and strengthens us through Him coming to us in church where we are fed with the very body and blood of Jesus Christ, our Savior, in Holy Communion. Jesus's very body and blood were given and shed for us for the forgiveness of sins. Through Holy Communion, our souls are refreshed and renewed; they are strengthened in faith in God to lead a new and holy life. *"Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me"* (Psalm 51:10).

It is one thing to plan to clean something and then do it. That plan is taken to the next level when that plan also includes protection for all that is now clean. God did not just make His plan to send Jesus into the world to take away our sins. He also sends His Holy Spirit to dwell in our hearts to protect us from the devil and his demons. The Holy Spirit helps strengthen and nurture our faith in God and our love for one another. By remaining faithful to God, we are the salt of the earth and the light of the world (Matthew 5:13-16). *"But if we walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin...If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness"* (1 John 1:7, 9).

As you plan for, execute, and protect your spring cleaning, do not forget to also allow God to spring clean your heart, mind, and soul. Be in God's Word daily. Pray without ceasing. Remember the Sabbath Day by keeping it holy. By doing these things, God cleanses us from our sins and reminds us of His forgiveness through Jesus Christ.
