
Whatever you decide to do, remember you are sharing the love of Jesus with others on a day the Lord has made; so, rejoice and be glad in your serving today.






Alex will be attending Ripon College, majoring in pre-law and psychology and playing basketball.

Elliott will be attending Carthage College, majoring in business and playing golf.




