A Message from Mr. Derek Bult

Dear LHS Community,

Roses are red, emeralds are green, violets are blue, and the sun is golden. Let me explain. Spring is on my mind, and there is never a shortage of happenings for educational institutions at this time of year. Spring 2024 at Lutheran High is no exception. So allow me to give you a colorful glimpse at what's going on.

Roses are **red**, like the precious blood of the Lamb, Jesus Christ, that washes us clean. This spring, I'll be wrapping up my Lutheran High Sunday visits. I thoroughly enjoy the opportunity to worship our Savior with you at the various churches. I love the interactions we have: the stories I am told of individuals who attended LHS, or those who sent their children to LHS; the questions that are asked of how the school is doing; or just the friendly hellos and good mornings. Many times, I am asked why LHS is not at the churches more often. That is a valid question and one that does not get addressed often. We schedule 18 Lutheran High Sundays at 20 different churches throughout the school year. As much as I enjoy going to the different Lutheran churches, I also have the vocation of leading my family in their spiritual needs, which can be difficult when we attend different churches. Some may say that other teachers could do Lutheran High Sundays. True enough. However, they need their spiritual faith strengthened and renewed each weekend as they give so much of themselves and their spirit each week through their teaching. I look forward to the next round of Lutheran High Sundays beginning again in fall.

Emeralds are **green**, like Crusader green. LHS is currently in recruiting mode. We are searching for the next class of students who will call LHS home and proudly wear the green and gold for the next four years. LHS has an annual goal of recruiting 50 or more freshmen. This is a tall and important task. A number of recruiting events have happened recently or are coming up this spring, including:

- Two Open Houses
- Experience Days for the Sheboygan Area Lutheran Schools (SALSA) 7th and 8th graders
- A joint field trip for SALSA 5th and 6th graders to Christopher Farm and Gardens
- An all-school assembly during National Lutheran Schools Week (recap on page 3)
- Jr. Crusader Nights for volleyball and boys' and girls' basketball
- A matinee of the spring musical for elementary students

Plus, we have a educational consultations, shadow days, a full offering of Crusader Summer Camps, and our annual Community Family Fair...to name a few! All these experiences are valuable, no doubt, but our biggest recruitment tool is word of mouth. It is our prayer that you might encourage youth in your midst to consider Sheboygan Lutheran for their high school experience.

Violets are **blue**. Violets begin to bloom in March, which is when the LHS drama department presents its spring musical, *Bye Bye Birdie*, this year. Details for the March 15-17 performances are on page 11 and on our website at lutheranhigh.com/pac.

Finally, the sun is **golden**. The Executive Director Call Committee has been working hard to find the golden candidate for the position. The committee has received names through numerous entities and gone through its first round of vetting. The remaining candidates have been contacted and asked if they would allow their name to stand on the committee's list of potential candidates. The next step is for the candidates to interview, followed by bringing the top 2 or 3 candidates to LHS's campus for an interview with select faculty, staff, and community members. The hope is that the top candidate's name can be submitted to the LHS Board of Directors in March to extend a Divine Call or a contract to be the next Executive Director at LHS.

Our Association Advocates

What is an Advocate? Our Sheboygan Area Lutheran High School Association (SALHSA) is comprised of twelve financially supportive congregations and our high school, managed by a Board of Directors. A crucial but lesser-known link in this structure is our Advocate system. An Advocate is a congregation member who serves as a liason between Lutheran High and his or her congregation, communicating important information between the two organizations.

Each congregation in the SALHSA elects up to four Advocates who are in good standing with his or her respective congregation and who support Christian education, especially at the secondary high school level. The elected Advocates help to promote, support, and advance the mission of the school: *"Preparing Christian Leaders - One Student at a Time."* The Advocates' duties include (but are not limited to) the following:

- Attend two bi-annual Board meetings in May and September, along with any special meetings that may be called throughout the year
- Ratify the annual operating budget
- Elect School Board nominees
- Report Lutheran High's matters to their congregations to inform and integrate the ministry at the congregation level. Lutheran High provides timely reports to help facilitate the information that the Advocates share with their congregations, typically at church council meetings and/or voters assemblies.
- Report congregational concerns and inquiries about Lutheran High to the LHS Board of Directors
- Promote enrollment of students and activities of Lutheran High
- Assist and attend, when possible, Lutheran High's activities that support the school academically, spiritually, and financially
- Pray for the Board, staff, and families of Lutheran High to make decisions that will grow and advance the school

We are thankful for the Advocates who faithfully fulfill this important role, and we continue to pray for the well-being and members of each congregation. We are stronger together! If you are interested in becoming an Advocate for your association congregation, please contact your pastor.

Caring Crusaders

Get to Know Tom & Jennifer Witt

Hearts of *gold*. That's what comes to mind when we think about Tom and Jennifer Witt.

Tom and Jennifer have been active advocates for Sheboygan Lutheran High from the very beginning, praying over the conversations in the 1970s and rejoicing once the decision to launch the school was made. Tom recalls testing soil samples of the site (formerly Hoppert Farm) and helping with site plans and building positioning of the school. Over the years, his passion for keeping LHS as sharp as it could be led him to volunteer on the building and grounds crew. He was also involved in the construction of the Performing Arts Center, laying flooring on the stage, painting, and doing anything he could to pitch in, even if it involved traversing the catwalk!



Jennifer was Lutheran High's school secretary from 1988-1998, and she "loved every minute." She fondly remembers daily interactions with the students, running the annual dinner auction by hand (not computer!), and closing the office so she could attend chapel with co-worker Audrey Sabrowsky. While plenty of hard work was accomplished, many laughs were also shared along the way. Jennifer affectionately recalls an incident with Mr. Ed Bierbaum's dog brain dissection specimen that caused fits of laughter among the office team. Tom joined in the reminiscing with tales of his homemade airhorn that he emphatically tooted every time the boys' soccer team scored a goal on their home field.

On March 23, 2024, Tom and Jennifer will celebrate their *golden* 50th wedding anniversary. Along with their Christian marriage, they count their family among their greatest blessings. Their son, Jay (LHS class of 1993), met his wife, Amanda, at Concordia River Forest. They have two boys, Jonah (15) and Sam (12), and live in Illinois where Jay works as an architect for Microsoft. Their daughter, Jessica (LHS class of 1996), is a nurse at Froedtert. She and her husband, Jeremy, live in Waukesha with their two girls, Journey (12) and Joule (9).

For the Witts, Christ-centered education is the *gold* standard. Tom experienced this firsthand when he attended Racine Lutheran High School in his youth. Once the decision was made to open Sheboygan Lutheran High School, they committed to sending Jay and Jessica there "with overwhelming joy." They were grateful for the gift of having their children in God's Word daily at LHS. And now they enjoy seeing Lutheran High students excel and stand out in the community with their exemplary work ethic and leadership skills.

Tom and Jennifer jokingly confess that their days of attending 'late night' Crusader games and activities have ended, but their love of the green and *gold* still runs deep! Now they enjoy staying involved at LHS in new ways. Tom is currently a Lutheran High Advocate for his home congregation, St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Sheboygan Falls, and a faithful volunteer at Neat Repeats Thrift Shop. They both enjoy attending our monthly Senior Citizen Bible Breakfasts, the annual auction and Taproot dinner, and any event where the talents of LHS students are shared. Their servant hearts extend beyond LHS, as they frequently volunteer at their church; ushering, serving on various committees, and volunteering at the Night to Shine event for those with special needs, to name a few.

The Witts are also passionate about stewardship. "We've been blessed in our retirement, and we try to pass those blessings along to ministries dear to our hearts." And when it comes to giving time and talents, they encourage others not to wait to be asked. Instead, "Just do it!"

As they reflect on years past and what Lutheran High has meant to them, Tom and Jennifer shared, "Each step of the way, the Lord is preparing each one of us for His perfect purpose, even if we don't recognize it at the time." And they are holding out hope for life-long dreams of a toboggan run down our campus hill and ice skating on the LHS pond. Who knows? Maybe by Lutheran High's *golden* anniversary in 2028, those wintry dreams will come true!

Impact Tomorrow Today

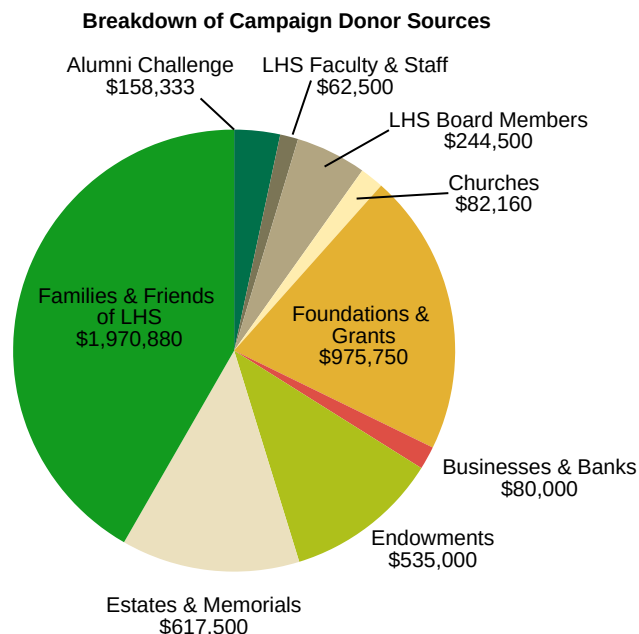
Capital Campaign

Our Performing Arts Center is as vibrant of a place as we could have imagined! Musicals, bi-weekly chapel services, shows, dance recitals, plays, guest speakers, concerts, and community events - the impact is happening! We are humbled to know that the friends and families of LHS believed in building a theater, plus a robotics lab and renovated science wing, worthy of their support.

Construction was completed with a final cost of \$10 million, \$4.8 million of which was raised through the initial capital campaign, *Preparing for the Future* (2018-2022), from over 400 donors. For those who like to see it 'by the numbers', take a peek at the pie chart.

We are currently in the second (debt reduction) campaign, *Impact Tomorrow Today*. Let's take a look at some comparisons:

- 96 donors (couples or individuals) made commitments over 1-3 years to the *Preparing for the Future* campaign. Out of the 96, 32 have renewed their previous commitment at the same or a different level.
- During the initial building campaign phase, we received over \$900,000 from outright gifts to the campaign from 270 individuals or couples, and 30 of them have already stepped up again to help our cause. If we could get everyone to 'regift' toward the *Impact* campaign, we'd have almost \$1M.
- And there were one-time estate gifts that were designated to the building project, as well as some that were undesignated but prioritized to the building project that won't be recurring.

As of Jan. 31, the *Impact Tomorrow Today* campaign has received over \$230,000 in the short time since the booklet mailing kicked off the campaign in late August 2023. With already almost 150 responses from our LHS family of supporters, we have raised \$445,000 with gifts received and commitments. The short-term goal for 2024 is to receive an additional \$750,000 to put toward our principle and interest. Next year (2025), with the steering committee's push to engage with more foundations and the business community to respond to our initiative, the goal is \$1.25M.

The countdown to September 2025 is on, as we will have the misfortune of relinquishing our sweet 3.95% interest rate for a larger one. Every dollar received is one on which we won't have to pay a higher interest rate. Please visit lutheranhigh.com/capital-campaign for further details.
