A Special Event-filled August

Seems like school just got out, but it's coming back soon! That's right, school starts in August for all Lutheran High students. **"Back to School Night"** is August 18th and the first full day of school is August 23rd. In addition to the excitement of school starting, we have some other special events coming up in August that will interest you. Please put these dates and events on your calendar.

Friday, August 12th – Lutheran/Kohler/Christian football team will be hosting a **brat fry** from 5 - 7 p.m. 50% of the proceeds of this event will benefit the football program, the other 50% will fund Lutheran High classroom technology enhancements.



Saturday, August 13th (9:30 a.m. race time) – Lutheran High's student service group, GLOW, will be sponsoring/hosting a **"Crusade for the Cure!"** 5k race/walk on the cross country course. The funds raised from this event will be sent to the MACC Fund to help in the fight against cancer.

Also on Saturday, August 13th (beginning at 1:00 p.m.) – Lutheran High will be hosting the Sheboygan Optimist Club's **"Lambeau Hoops for Youth"** venture in the gymnasium. Former Green Bay Packer players will play an exhibition basketball game against students from local high schools (including Lutheran High alumni John Dekker and Nick Leibham). The team is coached by LHS Varsity coach, Todd Dekker. At half-time, autographs from the Packer players will be available. Tickets are open to the public and can be purchased at Miesfeld's, Weimann's Sports Center, all Qmart locations, and at Lutheran High (cost is \$10 per ticket). Proceeds for the Optimist Club will benefit local youth projects. Lutheran High profits from the concession stand sales will be used for student scholarships.

Weill Center) – Lutheran High is excited to report that the very popular **KIDS FROM WISCONSIN** troupe comes to Sheboygan for two special nights.
