MR. BULT'S MESSAGE

Dear LHS Families, Students, and Community,

Have you finished celebrating Easter? Are all of your Easter decorations put away and now on to spring decorations? Easter is not just one day of celebrating but seven weeks of celebration. During these weeks, the Bible readings we hear in church each tell us all about Jesus's appearances after His resurrection. For 40 days, Jesus showed Himself to His disciples and others in order for us, here and now, to believe in Jesus's resurrection.

How many times do we find ourselves just like Jesus's disciples: scared, terrified, and locked behind closed doors? On that first Easter evening, the disciples, being terrified, are locked in a room, in fear of the Jews, not believing Jesus had truly risen from the dead. Jesus's first words are, "*Peace be with you*" (John 20:19b). Think about these words. These are words of forgiveness and absolution from our Holy God, telling the disciples, and us sinners, through Jesus "I have peace with you" because He, Jesus, has conquered sin, death, and the devil. Jesus shows His disciples His hands and His side, showing He offered His body and shed His blood, the great price for the forgiveness of sins of the entire world. Jesus showed His hands and His side to remind the disciples of the great cost of sin but also to announce that the great price had been paid and accepted by His Father in heaven. Peace has been restored between God and man.

Of course, there is always someone missing. Thomas was not with the group. When the other disciples shared their joy at Jesus' appearance, Thomas doubted their report. "*Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand in his side, I will never believe*" (John 20:25). Thomas wanted to connect with Jesus through touch. Thomas received peace through the touch of Jesus.

Jesus appears again and speaks specifically to Thomas, saying, "*Put your finger here ... put out your hand, and place it in my side*" (John 20:27). Jesus was alive and physically present. This was Jesus's real body. He is not some ghostly phantom, not an imaginary voice where the disciples could not tell where it was coming from, or something the disciples imagined in their minds. This was truly Jesus. Thomas could actually touch Jesus. Jesus was physically alive. The peace that Jesus gave, and gives, was beyond anything Thomas, the disciples, or you and I could ever imagine.

Just like Thomas and the other disciples, we too have our doubts about Jesus. We do not put our full faith and trust in Him at all times. We live in a sinful world where peace is temporary. Peace with God does not just happen in a broken, fallen world, and it is no little thing. Jesus suffered real pain, agony, and the cross in our place. He was the touch point for God's wrath for us. He died our death. He was buried for us. Real blood, real flesh, real sacrifice, real forgiveness for us, real Jesus.

There are times when we are sad, heartbroken, or alone and wish we could touch Jesus or that He would come and touch us. Here is the good news: He is present, right here, right now, with each of us. "*And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age*" (Matthew 28:20b). In Holy Communion, Jesus tells us again and again, come, touch my body, drink my blood, let my Words touch your ears, receive forgiveness, receive My peace. You are forgiven.

While we wait for His touch, when we will be with Him in heaven, we know He is alive and that He is with us. Through the Holy Spirit's working in our Baptism, and the Spirit's gift of faith in God's Word, we know that Jesus is alive and that He is present with us always. Jesus speaks to us when He said to Thomas, "*Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed*" (John 20:29). Jesus is speaking to you and me!

He comes to give us peace. He is Risen! He is Risen indeed! Alleluia! Amen.

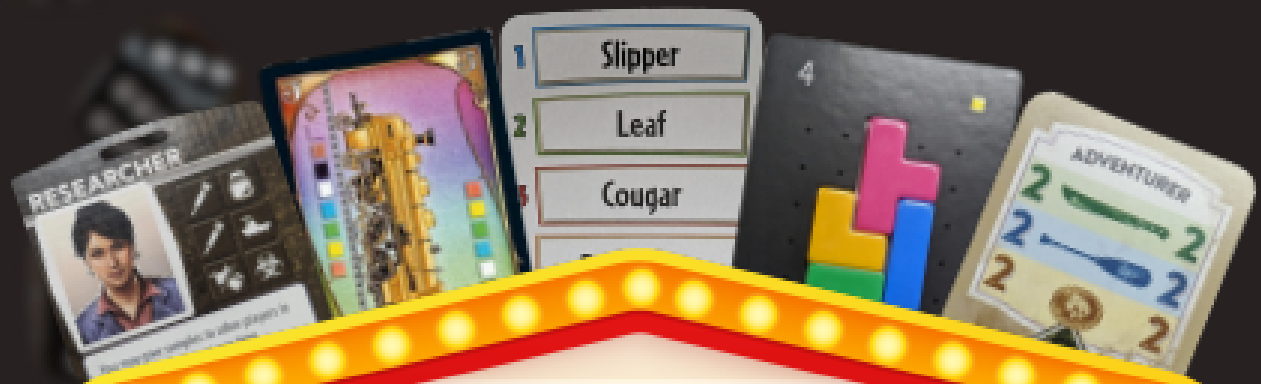
