LIFELONG LEARNING

At the beginning of March, I had the opportunity to attend the Association of Lutheran Secondary Schools (ALSS) Administrators Conference. Each year, this gathering offers a welcome reminder of the strength, unity, and shared purpose that connect Lutheran high schools across the country. One of the greatest blessings of the conference was the chance to connect with fellow Lutheran administrators. We celebrated what is going well in our schools, discussed challenges we face, and helped one another think through the next faithful steps for our respective high school ministries.

Along with these meaningful connections, the conference provided a variety of breakout sessions focused on topics important to the future of Lutheran secondary education. Keynote speakers provided messages that invited us to reflect on our leadership, our mission, and the rapidly changing world in which our students are living.
