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About LHS

Founded in 1978, Sheboygan Lutheran High School is a Christ-centered high school that recognizes the importance of a faith-based education rooted in Biblical truths. While distinctly Lutheran and affiliated with the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS), students from all faiths and denominations are welcome to attend Lutheran High. We are supported by twelve association congregations throughout Sheboygan County.

Student & Faculty Information

We serve approximately 185 students in grades 9-12. The average class size is 18 with a 12:1 student to faculty ratio. 9 of the 16 faculty members (56%) have advanced degrees in their field.

Accreditation

Sheboygan Lutheran is fully accredited by National Lutheran School Accreditation (NLSA)

Curriculum

We offer a college-prep curriculum with courses in art, business, computer science, English, Spanish, mathematics, music, physical education, science, social studies, and theology.

Dual credit courses are offered through the CAPP Program at UW-Oshkosh, online courses from Concordia University Wisconsin, and Advanced Placement (AP). See reverse for details.

Extracurricular Activities and Athletics

Sheboygan Lutheran is part of the Big East Conference of the WIAA, offering 14 interscholastic high school athletic programs. Additionally, music, drama, National Honor Society, student council, InterAct, as well as other clubs and organizations encourage students to explore and challenge their God-given abilities. Over 90% of our students are involved in at least one activity.

Mission in Action

The mission of Sheboygan Lutheran High School, *Preparing Christian Leaders - One Student at a Time*, is what makes it unique. At a time when the world needs Christian leaders more than ever, Sheboygan Lutheran High stands firm in its mission to share the Gospel of Christ with the students, and in turn, prepare them to proclaim their faith to others. This is done through unique initiatives, including a 4-year faith walk project, Christian Leadership courses, bi-weekly chapel services, Crusader Time, and school-wide community service days.
